What can the Holy Family teach me about giving to others?

As followers of Jesus, we are asked to give ourselves to others, imitating Christ's example of giving himself on the cross and in the Eucharist at every Mass.

This is not an easy road, as giving requires sacrifice – lots of it! Yet it is precisely in these sacrifices that you and I become the people God created us to be

In recognizing this great task, St John Paul II said "There is no place for selfishness – and no place for fear!... Do not be afraid, then, when love makes demands. Do not be afraid when love requires sacrifice."

Pope Francis' Words

The following are from Pope Francis' New Year's wishes as we entered 2022: Have you helped put the Pope's message into action this past year?

Peace, the pope said, "demands concrete actions. It is built by being attentive to the least, by promoting justice, with the courage to forgive, thus extinguishing the fire of hatred."

Pope Francis also championed embracing a positive attitude, "one that always sees, in the Church as well as in society, not the evil which divides us, but the good that unites us."

Pope Francis publicly ushered in 2022 by praising the skills which women bring to promoting peace in the world, and he equated violence against women to an offense against God.

He called for efforts to protect women. "How much violence is directed against women! Enough! To hurt a woman is to insult God, who from a woman took on our humanity," the pope said, referring to the Christian belief that Jesus was the son of God.

He said women, including mothers, "look at the world not to exploit it but so that it can have life. Women who, seeing with the heart, can combine dreams and aspirations with concrete reality, without drifting into abstraction and sterile pragmatism."

Trim down your high interest debt as fast as possible.

Would you have bought that \$1,000 big-screen TV if the price were \$1,180? That's what you'd pay if you added the 18 percent annual interest typically charged by a store credit card. Even if you're loath to tap your savings account, you'll come out ahead by using it to liquidate a high-interest debt that's been hanging around for months... if not years.

Be prepared for unexpected expenditures.
